**Subject : Issue of Aircraft Maintenance Engineer's Knowledge Examination Certificate.**

**1. Introduction**

The aircraft maintenance engineer's knowledge examination certificate is issued to a person who meets the requirements of this CAR. The certificate establishes the fact that he has acquired a level of knowledge relevant to the category of AME Licence to be granted by passing the written examinations conducted by DGCA.

This part of the CAR lays down the procedure for issue of aircraft maintenance engineers knowledge examination certificate.

**2. Procedure**

- 2.1 Central Examination Organisation (CEO) shall issue result sheets to individual candidates for examination subject/module passed by them.
- 2.2 Upon completion of all subject/module for a stream/category of licence, CEO (DGCA) will issue aircraft maintenance engineers knowledge examination certificate (Appendix A).

**3. Privileges**

The knowledge examination certificate does not confer any certification privileges.

#### 4. Validity

The knowledge examination certificate has no validity period.

#### 5. Categories of Basic Knowledge Examination Certificate.

<b>Stream</b>	<b>Category</b>
Mechanical stream (Aeroplane and Powerplants)	Light Aeroplanes (LA) Heavy Aeroplanes (HA) Piston Engine (PE) Jet Engine (JE)
Mechanical stream (Helicopters and Powerplants)	Rotary Wing Aircraft (RA) Piston Engine (PE) Jet Engine (JE)
Avionics stream	Electrical System (ES) Instrument System (IS) Radio Navigation System (RN)

Example:- A person who has passed Paper I, II and III (HA) of DGCA Licence paper examination may be issued knowledge certificate in mechanical stream (limited to HA only).

#### 6. Conditions for issue of Knowledge Examination Certificate

- 6.1 A Candidate should have completed the age of 18 years.
- 6.2 He shall have passed Papers I, II, and relevant Paper III or Modules of AME Licence examination.
- 6.3 Candidates meeting the above requirements shall be issued with a certificate by CEO, DGCA within 60 days.
