**Subject: Exercising of privileges of CPL/ ATPL Licences beyond the age of 65 years.**

Rule 28A of the Aircraft Rules, 1937 provides the maximum age limit for professional pilots and does not allow pilots to operate aircraft engaged in commercial air transport operations beyond the age of 65 years. Further, Section J, K, M and N of Schedule II of the Aircraft Rules, 1937 also restricts the privileges of CPL/ ATPL holders to that of PPL after the pilot has attained the age of 65 years.

In view of the above, the Deputy Director General of the region have been directed to endorse the CPL/ ATPL licences of pilots who have attained the age of 65 years in accordance with the provisions of the Aircraft Rules, 1937.

Any pilot who has attained the age of 65 years if found exercising the privileges of a licence above the category of PPL or rendering services for remuneration of any kind, whatsoever will be dealt with severely in accordance with the provision of the Aircraft Rules, 1937. Similar action would be taken against the organization using services of such pilots.
